• **Respondents**: Complainants often name more than one type of respondent.

• Probable Cause (pending cases excluded)

Complaints often contain more than one allegation. The Board makes a probable cause decision on each allegation contained in a complaint.

- Probable cause was found to exist for at least one allegation in 48% of complaints filed.
- o In 38% of all cases, at least one allegation was dismissed for lack of probable cause.
- In 14% of cases, there was no probable cause decision, for several reasons, including the complaint being withdrawn or administratively closed for jurisdictional reasons.

• Investigations & Hearings (pending cases excluded)

When probable cause is found, it is far more common for the Board to conduct an investigation without holding an evidentiary hearing. The Board has held evidentiary hearings in 23% of the cases in which probable cause was found and conducted investigations in 82% of cases in which probable cause was found.

- **Remedies** (pending cases excluded): The Board sought equitable relief in two cases. It has issued 18 private reprimands and 40 Reports and Recommendations.
- **Judicial Appeals** (pending cases excluded): To date, there have been 2 cases reversed on judicial review and 4 cases affirmed by judicial review.
