What is Crime Victim Compensation?

Victims of crime who suffer a personal injury, and family or household members of deceased victims may have out-of-pocket expenses through no fault of their own.


Crime Victim Compensation (CVC) can pay up to \$40,000 or up to four years of eligible crime-related expenses that are not covered by any other source.

How do you apply?













Submit your CVC application.



A claims specialist will be assigned.



The CVC program will request the police report and determine eligibility.



For eligible claims, payments will be made when the program receives the required documentation.



For ineligible claims, a written denial with appeal information will be mailed to you.

The time it takes to determine eligibility varies depending on the complexity of the claim. Submitting all requested materials in a timely manner to the CVC Program will help facilitate the processing of your claim.


