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1 REVIEW OF ACT 183

In August 2020, the Wisconsin Assembly created a task force to focus on “racial disparities, educational opportunities, public safety, and police policies and standards in Wisconsin.” In its final report, entitled *The Report of the Task Force’s Subcommittee on Law Enforcement Policies and Standards*, the task force offered various recommendations for improving law enforcement practices in Wisconsin. This report was the foundation for 2021 Assembly Bill 329 and 2021 Wisconsin Act 183, which modified Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20).

Enacted on March 17, 2022, 2021 Wisconsin Act 183 created a new section of Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20), which requires the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) to “submit a report to the legislature under Wis. Stat. § 13.172(2) on the issuance and execution of search warrants at physical premises by law enforcement agencies in the prior calendar year” and to provide law enforcement instructions for submitting the data to DOJ. The report is due to the legislature by no later than July 1 of each year.

2 PROGRESS TO DATE

In the last year, staff from the DOJ Bureau of Justice Information and Analysis (BJIA), assisted by staff from the DOJ Bureau of Computing Services (BCS), completed requirements documentation and commenced an official development project to create a new data collection form.

The initial form, built by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT) using the Traffic and Criminal Software (TraCS), has been developed and the first round of testing by DOJ has been completed. This form will replace the REDCap survey beginning January 2026. Law enforcement agencies will be expected to complete the new form in TraCS monthly. The Department of Transportation is expected to have the form development completed and launched in the TraCS software by fall 2025 in order for agencies to begin reporting in January 2026. A copy of the current version of the form can be found in Appendix A.

BJIA also launched enhancements to contact forms in 2024 that will enable agencies to more easily identify appropriate points of contact, including agency leadership, as well as Uniform Crime Reporting, Use of Force/Arrest-Related Death, and Search Warrant data collections contacts for each agency.

3 2024 LAW ENFORCEMENT DATA

Survey Design

For 2024 data, the same survey form from 2023 (see Appendix B) was used in REDCap including questions addressing the required data elements from Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20).

Responses

The survey was sent via email by BJIA staff to individuals listed as the search warrant data collection contact and the head of the agency on May 8, 2025, with a requested completion date of May 23. A second email was sent to individuals on the contact list maintained by the Training and Standards Bureau (TSB) on May 21. Individual reminder emails were sent out by BJIA staff on June 2 to agencies that had not yet responded with follow-up calls made the week of June 9. Responses for this report were exported on June 13, 2025.

BJIA received a total of 413 responses, not including duplicates. Any duplicate surveys from agencies were removed after following up with the agencies to confirm the correct submission. If duplicate responses were received from an agency and both responses indicated zero warrants, the duplicates were removed without agency follow-up.

Findings

Of the 413 reports submitted by law enforcement agencies, 180 (43.6 percent) stated that their agencies had zero warrants approved or denied for calendar year 2024 (Appendix C), while 233 (56.4 percent) had at least one (Appendix D). The data below is based on the 233 agencies that reported warrants for 2024.

Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20)(a): The total number of search warrants¹ that were issued and denied.

Issued: 2,107

Denied: 4

Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20)(b): Of the search warrants that were issued, the number that requested explicit authorization of an unannounced entry, and of those that requested explicit authorization of an unannounced entry, the number that explicitly authorized and the number that declined to authorize an unannounced entry.

Eleven agencies (Appendix E) requested at least one no-knock warrant.

Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20)(c): Of the search warrants that declined to authorize an unannounced entry, the number of search warrants that were executed with an unannounced entry and the number that were executed with an announced entry.

¹ The survey asked how many search warrants at physical premises that were requested by the agency were approved/issued/denied, matching the language in the statute “*the issuance and execution of search warrants at physical premises by law enforcement agencies in the prior calendar year.*” Physical premises were defined in the survey as “*a specific location or property that law enforcement officials believe may contain evidence of a crime or contraband, restricted to residences, private businesses, government buildings, correctional facilities, education facilities/institutions, garage/storage units, farms, and religious institutions.*”

- No warrants met these criteria for 2024.

Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20)(d): Of the search warrants that declined to authorize an unannounced entry that were executed with an unannounced entry, all of the following information:

1. The number of warrants for which a return under Wis. Stat. § 968.17 was accompanied by a written inventory of property taken as provided under Wis. Stat. § 968.17(1). **Not applicable - no declined warrants executed with an unannounced entry.**

2. The number of warrant executions that resulted in great bodily harm, as defined in Wis. Stat. § 939.22(14), to any person, or the death of any person. **Not applicable - no declined warrants executed with an unannounced entry.**

3. The age, race, and gender of any primary suspect who was present at the warrant's execution. **Not applicable - no declined warrants executed with an unannounced entry.**

Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20)(e): Of the search warrants that explicitly authorized an unannounced entry, the number of search warrants that were executed with an announced entry and the number that were executed with an unannounced entry.

- Thirty-four of 42 warrants that were authorized as no-knock/unannounced entry were executed as knock and announce entry by 6 agencies.
- Eight of 42 warrants that were authorized as no-knock/unannounced entry were executed as no-knock/unannounced entry by 5 agencies.

Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20)(f): Of the search warrants that explicitly authorized an unannounced entry, the type of suspected crime² for which it was sought.

- Of the 11 agencies that had an unannounced entry/no-knock explicitly authorized for at least one warrant, 4 agencies selected murder as a crime type, 1 agency selected negligent manslaughter, 1 agency selected assault, 3 agencies selected robbery, 3 agencies selected other person offense, 3 agencies selected drug trafficking, 2 agencies selected other drug offense, 2 agencies selected public order weapons, 3 agencies selected other public order offense, and 1 agency selected court order violation as the reason(s) for their seeking the no-knock warrant(s).

Wis. Stat. § 165.25(20)(g): Of the search warrants that explicitly authorized an unannounced entry and were executed with an unannounced entry, all of the following information:

1. The number of warrants for which a return under Wis. Stat. § 968.17 was accompanied by a written inventory of property taken as provided under Wis. Stat. § 968.17(1). **Eight of 8 warrants.**

² Agencies could select multiple crime types from a list, and the number of selections could be more than the number of warrants (e.g. one warrant could have had multiple suspected crime types chosen).

2. The number of warrant executions that resulted in great bodily harm, as defined in Wis. Stat. § 939.22(14), to any person, or the death of any person. **No warrants.**

3. The age, race, and gender of any primary suspect who was present at the warrant's execution. **Six males (2 White and 4 Black/African American; 4 adult and 2 juvenile primary suspects) were present during authorized unannounced/no-knock entries.**

A review of this information by jurisdiction is provided in Appendices C-E.

NOTE: These numbers are from 413 agencies with jurisdictions that encompass approximately 77.1 percent of the state's population. As such, this information is incomplete and should be used for preliminary discussion purposes only. Population data used is provided by the FBI and based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Population Estimates. Universities and federal and state agencies do not have a specific population identified for their jurisdiction. Additionally, the law enforcement agencies that submitted the data are responsible for the accuracy of the data submitted.

4 NEXT STEPS

BJIA will continue to work with DOT on the completion of the TraCS search warrant form. This includes transmission testing to ensure data entered into the form is received accurately by DOJ, as well as testing required versus optional fields to ensure the form can still be transmitted without optional fields filled in. BJIA will also continue developing training materials and will communicate with the law enforcement community on training and next steps for this data collection program. Because the new form will require agencies to submit the data monthly rather than annually, and because the information for no-knock warrants will be collected at the warrant level on the new form rather than in aggregate, this will involve more work for BJIA to follow-up with non-submitting agencies and more time to analyze the individual form data. DOJ's budget request included a position in BJIA to complete the work necessitated because of this statutory requirement and the additional data that will be received starting in January 2026.
