¹ Wis. Stat. § 19.85 (1)(a) provides that a governmental body may convene in closed session for the purpose of “[d]eliberating concerning a case which was the subject of any judicial or quasi-judicial trial or hearing before that governmental body.”

Wis. Stat. § 19.85 (1)(f) provides that a governmental body may convene in closed session for the purpose of “[c]onsidering financial, medical, social or personal histories or disciplinary data of specific persons, preliminary consideration of specific personnel problems or the investigation of charges against specific persons except where par. (b) applies which, if discussed in public, would be likely to have a substantial adverse effect upon the reputation of any person referred to in such histories or data, or involved in such problems or investigations.”

Wis. Stat. § 19.85(1)(g) provides that a governmental body may convene in closed session for the purpose of “[c]onfering with legal counsel for the governmental body who is rendering oral or written advice concerning strategy to be adopted by the body with respect to litigation in which it is or is likely to become involved.”

Wis. Administrative Code CVRB 1.05(6) provides that upon a vote of the board, the board may deliberate and vote on the probable cause determination in closed session pursuant to s. 19.85 (1) (f), Stats.

Wis. Administrative Code CVRB 1.08 (3) provides in part that upon a vote of the board, the board may conduct its discussion of the final decision in closed session as provided by s. 19.85 (1) (a), Stats.
