**Officer Involved Shooting Investigation in Watertown, Wis.**

WATERTOWN, Wis.— The Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) is investigating an officer involved shooting (OIS) in Watertown, Wis. that occurred on the evening of Sunday, May 31, 2020.

Law enforcement from Watertown Police Department initiated a traffic stop in Watertown for a burnt-out taillight. Law enforcement had been looking for the subject to question him about his involvement in a domestic incident. Non-lethal means were deployed prior to an officer discharging his firearm and striking the white, male subject. A firearm was found on-scene.

Law enforcement immediately began life-saving measures on the subject, and paramedics later transported the subject to a nearby hospital. No law enforcement personnel or other individuals were injured during the incident.

The involved officer from Watertown Police Department will be placed on administrative leave, per department policy.

DCI is leading this investigation and is assisted by the Wisconsin State Crime Lab, Wisconsin State Patrol, and DOJ Office of Crime Victim Services. All involved law enforcement are fully cooperating with DCI during this investigation.

DCI is continuing to review evidence and determine the facts of this incident and will turn over investigative reports to the Jefferson County District Attorney when the investigation concludes.
