ICYMI: Kaukauna Man Sentenced Following Drug Trafficking Investigation

GREEN BAY, Wis. – On Sept. 15, 2025, Kaukauna man John R. Sloan, 58, was sentenced by a federal judge for the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin to 150 months in federal prison for possessing with the intent to distribute methamphetamine.

The sentencing, announced on Tuesday by Acting U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Wisconsin Richard G. Frohling, follows an investigation by the Lake Winnebago Area Metropolitan Enforcement Group – Drug Unit (LWAM), with assistance from the Wisconsin Department of Justice Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

“Meth devastates people’s health and wellbeing,” said AG Kaul. “Thank you to everyone whose efforts helped in obtaining the excellent outcome in this case.”

During the investigation, law enforcement seized more than 7 pounds of methamphetamine, over \$140,000 cash, four firearms, and a vehicle. According to court records, Sloan admitted to distributing more than 20 pounds of methamphetamine in the Fox Valley area. At the time of the offense, Sloan was on state supervision for a distribution of methamphetamine conviction, according to the U.S. Attorney’s Office. In addition to federal prison time, Sloan was ordered to forfeit to the government over \$140,000 of contraband currency, as well as four firearms and the vehicle.

The case was investigated by LWAM, with assistance from DCI and the DEA. It was prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Wisconsin.
